Article 1

Introductory Provisions

(1) The Scholarship Code of the Czech University of Life Sciences Prague (hereinafter referred to as the "Scholarship Code") is, in accordance with Section 17, para. 1, letter h) of Act No. 111/1998 Coll., on Higher Education Institutions and on Amendments and Additions to Acts (the Higher Educational Act), as amended, (hereinafter referred to as the "Act"), an internal regulation of the Czech University of Life Sciences Prague (hereinafter referred to as the "CZU") and applies to the provision of scholarships to students enrolled in studies at the CZU and its faculties or performing professional, scientific or other activities within a university institute or university agricultural or forestry estate (hereinafter referred to as the "university estate").

(2) This Scholarship Code stipulates the criteria for awarding scholarships in accordance with Section 91 of the Act from the resources of the scholarship fund or other own resources of the CZU, from contributions or subsidies, from funds concentrated in the National Fund or from other public funds provided to the CZU under another legal regulation or within the implementation of an international treaty by which the Czech Republic is bound. This Scholarship Code applies to students of the CZU who are enrolled in full-time or combined form of study in Bachelor's, Master's or Doctoral study programmes.

(3) The relevant provisions of Act and Act No. 500/2004 Coll., the Administrative Code, as amended, (hereinafter referred to as the "Administrative Code") apply to decisions on the rights and obligations of a student as a party to scholarship award proceedings.

Article 2

Types of scholarships and their sources

(1) In accordance with the law, the following scholarships may be awarded to students of the CZU:

- a) scholarship pursuant to Section 91, para. 2, letter a) of the Act, for outstanding study results (hereinafter referred to as the "merit scholarship");
- b) scholarship pursuant to Section 91, para. 2, letters b), c), e) and f) of the Act (hereinafter referred to as the "extraordinary scholarship");
- c) scholarship pursuant to Section 91, para. 2, letter d) of the Act, in the case of a student's difficult social situation (hereinafter referred to as the "social scholarship");
- d) According to Section 91, para. 2, letter g) of the Act in other cases stipulated by the Scholarship Regulations;
- e) scholarship pursuant to Section 91a of the Act for students of doctoral study programmes (hereinafter referred to as the "doctoral scholarship").

(2) Scholarships may be paid from the following sources:

- a) from the CZU scholarship fund or other CZU own resources;
- b) from the state budget funds provided to the higher education institution in the form of a subsidy or contribution under the law;
- c) from funds concentrated in the National Fund or from other public funds provided to the CZU under another legal regulation or as part of the implementation of an international treaty by which

the Czech Republic is bound.

Article 3 Merit scholarship

(1) A merit scholarship may be awarded to students enrolled at the CZU for studies in Bachelor's or Master's degree programmes in the full-time form of study. The merit scholarship can also be awarded to graduates of a study programme who have fulfilled the conditions for its award during their studies at the CZU. The scholarship referred to in paragraph 6 may also be awarded to graduates of the combined form of study if they meet the required criteria.

(2) The details for the award of the merit scholarship, its amount for the given academic year and the deadlines decisive for the scholarship award procedure are, after discussion in the Academic Senate of the faculty (in the case of a university institute in the Academic Senate of the CZU), determined by an internal regulation of the faculty, i.e. by the Dean's Regulation. This internal regulation must be published in the public section of the faculty website.

(3) A scholarship is awarded retrospectively for outstanding study results in the previous period or periods of study, while an academic year or semester may be considered a period.

(4) Students enrolled in a Master's degree programme following a Bachelor's degree programme may also be awarded a scholarship for outstanding study results in previous studies in a Bachelor's degree programme if so stipulated by an internal faculty regulation in accordance with paragraph 2.

(5) A merit scholarship may be awarded as a one-off or as a regular monthly amount for a specified period of the academic year, but for a maximum of 9 months of the relevant academic year. For the months of July to September, the merit scholarship is not awarded and not paid.

(6) A special form of merit scholarship is a scholarship associated with the award of the Rector's Prize or commendatory recognition by the dean for outstanding study results during the entire study in accordance with the Study and Examination Rules for Study in Bachelor's and Master's Degree Programmes of the Czech University of Life Sciences Prague. This scholarship is paid as a one-off payment, its amount is part of the internal faculty regulation under paragraph 2.

Article 4 Extraordinary scholarship

(1) An extraordinary scholarship may be awarded to students enrolled at the CZU for studies in full-time or combined Bachelor's, Master's or Doctoral degree programmes, in particular for the following reasons:

- a) for outstanding research, development and innovation, artistic or other creative achievements contributing to the advancement of knowledge;
- b) for research, development and innovation activities under a special legal regulation;
- c) to support studies, creative activities, educational activities or practical internships carried out within the implementation of European Union programmes or other multilateral or bilateral international programmes or projects;
- d) to support the studies of CZU students abroad, including support for long-term and short-term internships and participation in summer schools abroad;
- e) to support studies at the CZU;
- f) to support professional internships and field trips of students in the Czech Republic and abroad;
- g) to support the participation of students in professional and promotional events, competitions and other activities related to the activities of the CZU, in the Czech Republic and abroad;
- h) to support the participation of CZU students in professional conferences in the Czech Republic and abroad;

- i) for participation in pedagogical, creative or advisory activities of the CZU, for cooperation in the preparation and solution of projects and for international cooperation;
- j) for outstanding sports results, such as support for CZU students with exceptional sports performance, for the CZU sports representation and for the payment of related costs (hereinafter referred to as the "sports scholarship");
- k) for outstanding results in the cultural and social field and the related representation and promotion of the CZU;
- l) to cover travel and other costs in connection with pedagogical or creative activities, counselling or representation of the CZU;
- m) to support the studies of students with disabilities or other disadvantages;
- n) for exemplary civic acts;
- o) students for excellent results achieved in the admission procedure or meeting selected criteria for admission to study (especially placement in subject competitions and Olympiads, excellent results at secondary school or at the school-leaving examination);
- p) for other important activities carried out for the benefit of the CZU, the faculty, the university estate and the academic community, and in other cases worthy of special consideration.

(2) Details on the award of extraordinary scholarships in selected areas may be regulated by internal regulations of the CZU, faculty, university institute or university estate, or may be granted by decision of the Rector, Dean or Director of the university estate. If the conditions are regulated by an internal regulation, it must be published in the public part of the website of the CZU, or the faculty, or other parts of the CZU. An internal regulation must always set out the conditions for the award of scholarships under Art. 1 letter o).

(3) An extraordinary scholarship may be awarded as a lump sum or as a regular monthly amount for a specified period of the academic year. The extraordinary scholarship may also be awarded repeatedly.

(4) The Rector, Dean or Director of a university estate may award an extraordinary scholarship in the form of an extraordinary prize to a student of the CZU; details, in particular regarding the awarding of prizes and their amount, are set out in the internal regulations of the CZU, or the faculty or university estate, which must be published in the public part of the website of the CZU or the faculty or university estate.

(5) An extraordinary scholarship pursuant to para. 1, letter c) may also be awarded to graduates of a study programme, participants in lifelong learning, academic staff and other employees of the CZU in accordance with Section 91, para. 3 of the Act, unless they are funded

- a) from the CZU scholarship fund, or
- b) from the state budget funds provided to the CZU in the form of a contribution, unless it is support for activities carried out within the implementation of an international treaty by which the Czech Republic is bound or an act issued on the basis of it, within the implementation of a European Union programme or another international programme or project, or within the framework of cooperation between the CZU and a foreign institution.

(6) A scholarship pursuant to para. 1, letter e) may also be granted to a student who is studying at the CZU as part of an exchange study stay.

(7) The specific amount, duration and conditions for the payment of the extraordinary scholarship are specified in the decision on the award of the scholarship.

Article 5 **Social scholarship**

(1) A CZU student who is enrolled in a Bachelor's, Master's or Doctoral study programme in a full-time or combined form of study and who is entitled to a benefit which includes a child bonus under the Act on State Social Assistance Benefits is entitled to a social scholarship if the decisive household income

in the decisive period, which includes the month of September, did not exceed the product of the amount of the household's subsistence minimum and a coefficient of 1.5.

(2) A student submits an application for a social scholarship to the Student Affairs Office of the faculty where he/she is enrolled in studies no later than one month from the date of enrolment in studies. If the child allowance was granted later, he/she submits the application no later than one month after it was awarded, but no later than 15 December of the relevant calendar year. It is not possible to apply for the social scholarship retroactively.

(3) A student can claim a scholarship only once in a certain period of time.

(4) The monthly amount of the social scholarship corresponds to one quarter of the monthly minimum wage, with the amount of the scholarship determined in this way being rounded up to whole tens of Czech crowns.

(5) A student is entitled to the payment of a social scholarship during the standard period of study, for each calendar month in which he/she meets the conditions for the award of a social scholarship for at least 15 calendar days, with the exception of the months of July and August.

(6) The social scholarship is usually paid three months retrospectively through the Student Affairs office of the Rector's Office.

(7) The specific amount, duration and conditions for the payment of the social scholarship are specified in the decision on the award of the scholarship.

Article 6

Accommodation scholarship

(1) An accommodation scholarship may be awarded to students who meet the following conditions:

- a) they are students of a Bachelor's, Master's or Doctoral study programme enrolled in full-time study; outgoing Erasmus+ trainees can also apply if they are enrolled in a combined form of study;
- b) they are studying in the first study programme or in a follow-up study programme, or they have transferred from one study programme to another, and their previous studies have been recognised; in the case of concurrently studied study programmes, a student is entitled to accommodation scholarship once at most, in the study programme in which he/she was enrolled earlier;
- c) not exceed the standard length of study in any of the concurrently studied study programmes;
- d) they do not have permanent residence in the territory of the Capital City of Prague or in the district in which their place of study is located; outgoing trainees can also apply if they live in Prague or in the district where their place of study is located;
- e) they have provided correct bank account details in the electronic information system of the CZU, thereby giving consent to receive this scholarship.

(2) An accommodation scholarship may also be awarded to students as trainees arriving within the Erasmus+ programme or within the framework of bilateral agreements with foreign institutions who are studying in the full-time form of study.

(3) The accommodation scholarship is paid retrospectively after three months on 31 December, 31 March and 30 June of the calendar year. Accommodation scholarships are not provided for the months of July to September.

(4) In the event of failure to meet any of the conditions specified in para. 1, the student loses his/her entitlement to an accommodation scholarship.

(5) An accommodation scholarship may not be awarded to a student:

- a) for the period when his/her studies were interrupted;
- b) from the day following the completion of studies pursuant to Section 55, para. 1 and Section 56 of the Act;

- c) from the day following the change in the conditions decisive for the award of the accommodation scholarship;
- d) who has already completed studies of the same type of study programme;
- e) they study within the framework of foreign development aid, international treaties and programmes.

(6) The amount of the accommodation scholarship is determined by calculation. The unit of calculation is the calendar day on which the student fulfilled the conditions for the award of the accommodation scholarship. The amount of the accommodation scholarship for one calendar day and one student is determined as the ratio of the amount attributable to the quarter to the number of calendar days awarded to all students in that quarter. The student will receive an accommodation scholarship for a quarter in the amount corresponding to the product of the accommodation scholarship for one calendar day and the number of calendar days in which he/she has fulfilled all the conditions for the award of the accommodation scholarship.

Article 7 **Sports scholarship**

- (1) A sports scholarship may be awarded and paid to students of the CZU who have demonstrated exceptional sports performance.
- (2) Sports scholarships are paid out of the faculty's scholarship funds on the proposal of the Head of the Department of Physical Education (hereinafter referred to as "CTV"), the Dean may adjust the amount of the sports scholarship.
- (3) Faculties may also pay sports scholarships not specified in this Scholarship Code in accordance with the conditions stipulated by the internal regulations of the faculty, i.e. by the Dean's Regulation.
- (4) Sports scholarships may be performance-based and extraordinary.
- (5) A CZU student who has demonstrated exceptional sports performance is entitled to submit an application for a performance sports scholarship twice per academic year using the appropriate form published on the CTV website. The student is required to complete all items listed in the form. The application deadlines are always by 15 November of the respective year in the winter semester and 15 March of the respective year in the summer semester. First-year students can apply for a performance scholarship only in the summer semester after meeting the conditions for advancement given by the Study and Examination Rules for Study in Bachelor's and Master's Degree Programmes of the Czech University of Life Sciences Prague and the Study and Examination Rules for Study in Doctoral Study Programmes of the Czech University of Life Sciences Prague.
- (6) The Committee for the Awarding of Performance Sports Scholarships shall divide students into performance categories on the basis of their performance and sports results and shall propose to the Dean of the relevant faculty the award of a performance sports scholarship. This committee is appointed by the head of the CTV. Its chairman is the head of the CTV.
- (7) The complete criteria for awarding performance sports scholarships, including the definition of four performance categories, will be published on the website of the Department of Physical Education by 15 October of the given year at the latest.
- (8) The performance sports scholarship is paid once per semester, and its amount is determined according to performance categories as follows:
 - a) Category I: max. CZK 20,000
 - b) Category II: max. CZK 15,000
 - c) Category III: max. CZK 10,000
 - d) Category IV: max. CZK 5,000
- (9) An extraordinary sports scholarship may be awarded as a lump sum for successful representation of the CZU in important sports competitions – the Czech Academic Games (hereinafter referred to as the

"ČAH"), the Primátorky Rowing Regatta, the Hockey Battle of the Universities, the Academic Championships of the Czech Republic (hereinafter referred to as the "AMCR"), medallists of World University games, etc.

(10) The extraordinary sports scholarship is awarded and paid by the faculties of the CZU on the proposal of the head of the CTV according to the results achieved.

(11) The extraordinary sports scholarship is paid as a one-off and the amount is:

a) for the successful representation of the CZU at the ČAH, AMCR and important academic competitions in individual sport (valid only for one discipline within one competition in a given sport):

1st place: CZK 6,000

2nd place: CZK 4,000

3rd place: CZK 2,000

b) for the successful representation of the CZU at the ČAH, AMCR and important academic competitions in team sports:

1st place: CZK 3,000

2nd place: CZK 2,000

3rd place: CZK 1,000

(12) Within the framework of the extraordinary sports scholarship, students of the CZU may also be paid for demonstrable costs associated with the student's participation in the above-mentioned major academic competitions and representation of the CZU (costs associated with the transport of persons and material, accommodation, meal allowance, possible damage to the student's own sports equipment and material, etc.). The amount of this scholarship is determined by the head of the CTV so that it corresponds to the amount of current costs according to the previous sentence and are part of the proposal under para. 10 of this article.

Article 8

Doctoral Study Income

(1) Doctoral study income means the sum of the monthly amount of funds of a doctoral scholarship awarded by the CZU or the faculty to a student of a doctoral study programme and the monthly amount of wages or salaries agreed, determined or determined for work in which the student performs creative activities related to the creation of his/her dissertation as an employee of the CZU working at the CZU or as an employee of a legal entity with which the CZU has concluded a cooperation agreement pursuant to Section 2, para. 8 or pursuant to Sections 81, 81d or 93 of the Act or another cooperation agreement (hereinafter referred to as the "cooperating employer").

(2) A student is entitled to a doctoral scholarship at the CZU pursuant to para. 3 in the case of the first study in one of the doctoral study programmes carried out by public or state universities or their faculties, and if the study takes place during the standard period of full-time study with an enrolment date after 01 September 2025.

(3) In the case of a student referred to in para. 2, when deciding on matters relating to his/her doctoral scholarship, the CZU shall ensure that the doctoral study income of the CZU student consists of:

a) only by a doctoral scholarship, where the amount of the doctoral scholarship is not lower than the currently valid amount of the minimum monthly wage multiplied by a coefficient of 1.2 and then rounded up to whole tens of Czech crowns,

b) a combination of the monthly wage or salary referred to in para. 1 and the doctoral scholarship, provided that the sum of two-thirds of the monthly wage or salary referred to in para. 1 and the entire amount of the doctoral scholarship shall not be lower than the minimum monthly wage multiplied by a coefficient of 1.2 and then rounded up to whole tens of Czech crowns.

(4) For the purposes of determining doctoral study income, two-thirds of the monthly salary or salary is included from the gross amount as determined.

(5) If a student's doctoral study income in accordance with para. 1 is at least higher in accordance with para. 3, letter a), the doctoral scholarship does not have to be awarded.

(6) A doctoral scholarship may be reduced below the level specified in para. 3 or withdrawn in case a student seriously fails to fulfil the study obligations arising from his/her individual study plan. The criteria for fulfilment or non-fulfilment of obligations are defined by the internal regulations of individual faculties. If the relevant doctoral programme board proposes, on the basis of the discussion of the evaluation of the fulfilment of the obligations of a doctoral student

- a) that the student should be allowed to "continue studies", the scholarship is not reduced;
- b) that the student should be allowed to "continue studies with a reprimand", the scholarship is withdrawn or reduced until the situation is remedied as determined by the doctoral programme board, and the withdrawal or reduction rate is defined by the internal regulations of the individual faculties; if the correction is not made within the set deadline, the scholarship will be withdrawn completely.

(7) In case of any change in the amount of the doctoral scholarship in accordance with para. 6, the procedure shall be initiated *ex officio*, with such change taking effect on the 1st calendar day of the month following the entry into force of the decision on the reduction or withdrawal of the doctoral scholarship.

Article 9

Doctoral scholarship

(1) A student enrolled in a full-time doctoral degree programme is entitled to a doctoral scholarship in cases other than in accordance with Article 8, para. 2. The doctoral scholarship is awarded and paid for the duration of the standard period of study, which is determined by the Study and Examination Rules for study in doctoral study programmes of the Czech University of Life Sciences Prague.

(2) A doctoral scholarship may be awarded as a one-off or as a regular monthly amount paid out for a specified period of the academic year.

(3) The entitlement to a doctoral scholarship paid as a regular monthly amount arises for each calendar month in which the student is enrolled in full-time doctoral studies for at least 15 calendar days. The total number of months for which the doctoral scholarship is awarded and paid may not exceed the number of months of the standard study period determined pursuant to para. 1.

(4) The specific amount, duration and conditions for the payment of a doctoral scholarship are specified in the decision on the award of a scholarship; details of the doctoral scholarship are set out in an internal regulation of the faculty, which must be published in the public part of the website of the relevant faculty.

(5) The decision as to whether a student enrolled before 01 September 2025 is subject to the provisions on doctoral study intake set out in Article 8 is within the full competence of individual faculties and is defined by internal faculty regulations.

Article 10

Decision on the award of scholarship

(1) When determining the specific amount of scholarships in the scholarship award procedure, the CZU, faculties, university institute and university estates shall take into account their financial resources and means, the amount and purpose of the resources provided and available, and the number of students who have fulfilled the conditions for the award of individual types of scholarships.

(2) Proceedings concerning the award of merit scholarship in accordance with Article 3 take place in the first instance at the faculty where the student is enrolled in study. The procedure is initiated by the Dean *ex officio* on the basis of compliance with the conditions laid down by the Act, this Scholarship

Code and the internal regulations of the Faculty pursuant to Article 3, para. 2 and the issuance of the decision is the first act in these proceedings.

(3) Proceedings in the matter of awarding an extraordinary scholarship in accordance with Article 4 are initiated:

- a) by the Dean, Rector or Director of a university estate *ex officio*, if the award of a scholarship is based on an internal regulation of the faculty, university estate or the CZU pursuant to Article 4, para. 2;
- b) by the dean or the rector *ex officio*, if any of the reasons listed in Article 4, para. 1 have been fulfilled;
- c) by the Dean, in the case of a student enrolled in studies at a faculty, or by the Rector, in the case of a student who is not enrolled at any of the faculties of the CZU, always on the basis of a student's application for the allocation of an extraordinary scholarship submitted in writing to the Student Affairs Office of the faculty or university institute;
- d) by the director of a university estate *ex officio*, if the reason specified in Article 4, para. 1, letter p) has been fulfilled; if the award of an extraordinary scholarship relates to a university estate.

(4) If the proceedings pursuant to para. 3, letters a), b) and d) were initiated *ex officio*, the issuance of the decision constitutes the first act in these proceedings.

(5) If the proceedings pursuant to para. 3, letter c) were initiated at the request of the student, the Rector or the Dean shall issue a decision within 30 days of the commencement of the proceedings. The commencement of the proceedings is considered to be the date on which the student's application for the award of the scholarship is submitted to the electronic information system of the CZU.

(6) Proceedings in the matter of the award of an extraordinary social scholarship in accordance with Article 2, para. 1, letter c) commences on the date of submission of the application to the CZU electronic information system. The decision is issued by the Dean of the Faculty within 30 days of the initiation of the proceedings.

(7) Proceedings concerning the award of an accommodation scholarship pursuant to Article 6 shall be initiated *ex officio* on the basis of verification of compliance with the conditions pursuant to Article 6; The issuance of the decision is the first act in these proceedings. The decision is issued by the Vice-Rector designated by the Rector.

(8) Proceedings concerning the award of doctoral scholarships in accordance with Articles 8 and 9 are carried out at the faculty where the student is enrolled in studies. The proceedings are initiated pursuant to Article 8 upon delivery of the application by the student of the doctoral study programme of the CZU, The decision is issued by the Dean of the faculty within 30 days of the commencement of the proceedings. Proceedings in the matter of the award of a doctoral scholarship may also be initiated *ex officio* if the doctoral scholarship is reduced, increased or withdrawn, or if the doctoral scholarship is awarded in cases other than under Article 8, para. 2. The doctoral scholarship is awarded separately for each academic year or part thereof. The proceedings are initiated by the Dean *ex officio* on the basis of verification of compliance with the conditions laid down in Article 9; the issuance of the decision is the first act in these proceedings.

(9) Proceedings concerning the award of sports scholarships in accordance with Article 7 shall be carried out at the faculty at which the student is enrolled. The proceedings are initiated:

- a) pursuant to Article 10 by delivery of the application by the CZU student within the deadlines specified in Article 7, para. 5 in the case of a student with exceptional sports performance;
- b) the Dean or the Rector *ex officio*, if the award of the scholarship is based on an internal regulation of the faculty or the CZU pursuant to Article 7, paras. 9 and 10.

(10) In case the proceedings are initiated at the student's request, the application must contain information on the type of scholarship that the student is applying for and the reasons underlying the application. Furthermore, the student shall provide the name, surname, date of birth, and the application shall be supported by the relevant documents necessary for the decision. If the application or submitted documents contain defects, the student is asked to remove them.

(11) In accordance with Section 69a of the Act and Article 28, para. 7 of the CZU Statutes are delivered to students via the CZU electronic information system. The decision is delivered at the moment when the student logs in to the system after it is made available to the student in the electronic information system of the CZU. If he/she does not log in within 10 days of the date on which the decision was made available to him/her in the electronic information system of the CZU, the decision shall be deemed to have been delivered on the last day of this period.

(12) A student may appeal against a decision that rejected his/her application within 15 days of its notification to the body that issued the contested decision. The appellate body is the Rector.

(13) The Rector reviews the compliance of the contested decision and the proceedings that preceded the issuance of the decision with the legal regulations and internal regulations of the CZU, faculties and university estates.

Article 11

Scholarship Payment

(1) Upon enrolment in study in a study programme, a student is obliged to state the bank account number for the payment of scholarships awarded to him/her by entering this number in the electronic information system of the CZU; the student is obliged to update this information in the electronic information system of the CZU without undue delay in the event of a change of the bank account number for the payment of scholarships awarded to him/her.

(2) A student is obliged to notify immediately the Student Affairs Office of the faculty, or in the case of doctoral studies, the Department of Science and Research at which he/she is enrolled in studies, of any facts affecting the payment of scholarships. The same applies to recipients of scholarships from a university estate, in which case the student is obliged to notify the economic deputy of the university estate immediately of all facts that affect the payment of the scholarship.

(3) Scholarships are paid by wire transfer to the scholarship recipient's bank account. In exceptional cases, the scholarship may be paid in cash by decision of the Dean, Rector or Director of the university estate.

(4) Doctoral, merit and extraordinary scholarships are usually paid by the 10th day of the month following the relevant pay period. Social and accommodation scholarships are usually paid on the 25th day of the month following the end of the relevant decisive period.

(5) Scholarships are paid in Czech currency.

(6) A scholarship is not awarded or paid for the period when the student's studies were interrupted, for the period following the date of completion of studies in accordance with Section 55, para. 1 of the Act. and Section 56 of the Act, or for the period following the date on which the change in the conditions decisive for the award of the scholarship occurred.

(7) Scholarships, with the exception of social scholarships and doctoral scholarships in accordance with Section 91a of the Act, may not be awarded or paid out in the event that a student fails to fulfil his/her obligations under Section 63 of the Act.

(8) If it becomes apparent that a scholarship has been paid to a student unjustifiably, the student is obliged to return the scholarship provided in this way on the basis of a written request from the CZU; in the event that the student does not obey this request, the CZU shall proceed in accordance with the law.

Article 12
Final Provisions

(1) The Scholarship Code of the Czech University of Life Sciences Prague registered with the Ministry of Education, Youth and Sports on 10 September 2025 under Ref. No. MSMT-21886/2025-2 is hereby repealed.

(2) This Scholarship Code was approved in accordance with Section 9, para. 1, letter b) of the Act by the Academic Senate of the CZU on 11 December 2025.

(3) This Scholarship Code shall enter into force in accordance with Section 36, para. 4 of the Act on the date of registration by the Ministry of Education, Youth and Sports.

(4) This Scholarship Code shall enter into force on the first day of the month following the date of its validity.
