Why Tallinn University/Tallinn?

Tallinn University lives up to the highest European standards, having a wide range of activities, open lectures and after-classes in varied scientific fields and research (Jelizawieta Poland | academic year 2007/2008).

Tallinn is the most central place in Eastern-Northern Europe (it is easy to travel to Helsinki, Riga, Stocholm, St. Petersburg, Moscow). I decided to have my ERASMUS here because I am interested in knowing a new and so different country then mine, with a different culture and a really different language. Tallinn University is an institute of culture with a high level of knowledge and that offers a lot of opportunities for studying many different subjects in totally different areas (Nicola | Italy | academic year 2009/2010).

Atmosphere at Tallinn University was great and friendly- we had a meeting with Rector, Erasmus Student Network and International Club where organizing for us a lot of events (Iwona | Poland | academic year 2008/2009).

Before coming I was a little bit worried how I will communicate with people in Estonia, in what language, but fortunately it was so easy - every second person speaks English, many speak Russian also. Tallinn is a mixture of everything one may need - history, attractions, nightlife, new and old parts of the city, seaside, parks, cultural life, mixture also of different cultures - Estonians, Russians and many others.... So I can say that even the cold weather cannot stop me to come back there! Also I can say that living in Tallinn is not very expensive (Veselina | Bulgaria | academic year 2008/2009).

When I think of Tallinn the word "modern" comes to my mind – Tallinn is the city where Skype was invented, where you can find many modern buildings, use your "Estonian ID card" to use copy machines, access the university library, public transport etc. Very good free Wifi internet connection in the university buildings, as well as in cafes, trains and buses – it made life so easy and comfortable (Tomasz | Poland | 2007/2008 academic year).

Tallinn University (www.tlu.ee/eng) is public institution of higher education. Its main strengths lie in the fields of humanities and social sciences, but it also has a strong and constantly growing component of natural and exact sciences, as well as a notable tradition of teacher training and educational research. Tallinn University is the third largest university in Estonia, consisting of 20 institutes and 5 colleges. It has over 9500 students, during the academic year 2009/2010 there were 330 international students (158 exchange and 172 degree students) from 54 countries. Exchange students came mostly from Turkey, Czech Republic, Poland, France.

Campus

Most of the buildings of Tallinn University are located in the city centre, in close proximity to Tallinn's medieval old town, the presidential palace and the museums of the classicistic Kadriorg park. The central campus on Narva Road/Uus-Sadama Street houses most of the institutes, with residences for students and visiting researchers only a short walk away on Karu Street. Additionally, there are university buildings in the old town (Institute of History, Institute of Fine Arts), in Tondi (Institute of Health Scienses and Sports), Mustamäe (Baltic Film and Media School and Law School) and Lasnamäe (Centre for Continuing Education). The Academic Library is situated on Rävala Avenue between "Estonia" opera house and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. Please see the city map

How to apply?

Application deadlines: June 1 for Autumn Semester and November 1 for Spring Semester

Required documents: www.tlu.ee/exchange

- · Learning Agreement
- Transcript of Credits (translated into English). Transcript of Credits is a certified list of all the courses and exams you have completed at the home university.
- Copy of the identification document (passport, ID)
- Certificate of language proficiency*
- * Not applicable for native speakers and students of the universities where English or Russian is the language of instruction.

How to prove language proficiency:

- · Language skills in English or Russian or Estonian are listed on the Transript of Credits; or
- · Submit Tallinn University Language Certificate (signed and stamped by your home university); or
- · Language Certificate from your home university; or
- Submit the copy of the English language test score (TOEFL, IELTS, etc)

Language skills of Bachelor level students have to correspond to level B1 (minimum). Language skills of Master and PhD level students have to correspond to level B2 (minimum).

Students selected to study at the Tallinn University should be able to follow university lectures in English or Russian or Estonian, participate in seminar discussions and understand written material in their field. In addition, most courses also require writing essays and research papers.

Practicalities (www.tlu.ee/practical)

- From January 1, 2011 Estonia will join the euro zone.
- The cost of living in Tallinn on average is 300 400 EUR per month, not including accommodation.
- Accommodation: prices range from 105 EUR (dormitory) to 300 400 EUR in private flats.
- Tallinn University dormitory is in 3 minutes walk from the main campus. Rent in double room is 105 EUR per person: www.tlu.ee/housing
- Tutors and Pick-up. Tutors are students who help international students to settle in to the academic environment

at Tallinn University and Tallinn in general. You will be met at your arrival in Tallinn.

- Residence Permits. Residence permit for study is required if an international student is going to stay in Estonia for more than three months. Citizens of EU/EEA member countries can apply for the right for residence in Estonia.
 Citizens of Non EU/EEA can see more information
- Health Care: EU/EEA citizens are entitled to the same social welfare benefits in Estonia as the residents of Estonia.
 Students coming from the EU/EEA countries should obtain an European health insurance card from the social service authorities in their home country before departure. Students from Non-EU/EEA countries have to obtain private health insurance.
- Student Organizations: Erasmus Student Network and International Club organize social events (movie nights, monthly parties, trips to various places in Estonia and abroad, museum and theatre visits,...) and support all international students while they are studying at Tallinn University.
