The Hall of Residence

Incoming students could be accommodated in the University Hall of Residence. This is a new building, inaugurated in February 2005, with all the possible facilities, such as reception; laundry (to be paid); kitchen on every floors; conference, study and computer rooms., public telephones installed in the common spaces. The hall of Residence has 154 rooms for students (in a double room with bathroom) and 29 rooms (single room with bathroom) for visiting scholars. Incoming students would have preference in the rooms' assignment. They must bring 2 photos, towels and kitchen accessories; sheets and blankets are supplied.

Prices are as follows: Prices - Euros 8 per day plus Euros 200,00 as deposit.

Payments - at the arrival: one month plus the deposit; the following months: bimonthly instalment payments in advance.

Credit cards are accepted.

The Hall of Residence is located 15 minutes by bus from the Faculty of Economics Marco Biagi and 20 minutes from the railway station (bus number 1).

In the Hall of Residence foreigners students would meet other graduate and undergraduate students coming from abroad on other International programmes as the University's policy is to give accommodation preference in this Hall of Residence to foreign students. Only a limited number of places is reserved to Italian students.

Italian Language Courses

The Language Centre of the University of Modena and Reggio Emilia offers Italian Language Courses for foreign language students. These courses are designed to improve students' general language skills and to help prepare them for participation in the academic and other activities important to them during their stay in Modena.

Courses are offered at three levels: Beginner, Intermediate, and Advanced. At the beginning of each semester students take a Placement Test and are assigned to a course. <u>Complete beginners</u> can attend extra lessons before the start of both semesters.

Courses run over two semesters for a total of 60 hours per semester: Semester I (September – December); Semester II (January – May). In each semester courses start with three 3-hour-lessons per week for the first two weeks, and continue with two 2-hour-lessons per week. Each course comprises 50 hours of language work (grammar consolidation and skills improvement) and 10 hours dedicated to "cultural" aspects of life in Modena (history, music, cooking).

At the end of each semester students can take an examination comprising a written and oral component.

Students are expected to attend classes regularly. Attendance is compulsory for students wishing to receive a credit certificate.

Other language resources available at the Language Centre include:

- a Language Advisor;
- multimedia and paper base language resources in the Self-Access Room, open from 10.00 to 17.00 Monday to Friday;
- enrolment in the Tandem Language Study Programme which organises one-to-one language exchanges between Italian and foreign language students.

Courses are free and open to University students (undergraduates and postgraduates) and researchers studying as part of Overseas Research Programmes at the University of Modena and Reggio Emilia.
