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

PORTUGAL IN BRIEF

Portugalisasmallcountrywithatotalareaofaround 92,000 km² and 10 million in habitants, located in south-westernEurope.IthasaverylongAtlantic coastlineandmagnificentbeachesthataregreatly appreciatedbyover12milliontouristseveryyear.

AsoneoftheoldestnationsinEurope,Portugalhasa richandinterestinghistorythatisreflectedintheart, landscape, and cuisine from north to south and also throughout the world.

Portugalhasundergonemassivepolitical, cultural, economic, and educational transformations over the last thirty years, since the revolution of 25 April 1974. It joined the European Union in 1986 and is nowamoderncountrywithmoderninfrastructures.

The majority of the population lives along 1214 km coastline, mainly concentrated incities as Lisboa, Porto, Aveiro, Coimbra, and Faro. To enjoy and be amazedbythebeautyofnatureitisrecommendedto visitthearchipelagosofAzoresandMadeira, exotic evergreenparadises with a temperature of above 14°C degrees during the whole year. Local time follows Greenwich Mean Time.

HISTORY AND GOVERNMENT

Havingalongandrichpast, Portugal has been an independentnationsince1143, apart from the period from 1580 to 1640 when it was under Spanishrule. It becamearepublicon5thOctober1910andnowadays is an established parliamentary democracy. The National Assembly is elected every four years.

Currently, the Socialist Party (PS) holds the majority inparliament. The head of the state is the President CavacoSilva, elected in the run of 2006 and the head of thegovernmentisthePrimeMinisterJoséSócrates.

The State and the different religious communities are completely separate in Portugal, which means that there is to tal freedom of conscience, religion, and worship. The Comprehensive Lawon the EducationSystem, however, guarantees freedom to teach any religion of any particular faith.

The origins of Castelo Branco go back to many centuries ago.

Severalarchaeologicalartefactswerefoundconfirmingthepresenceofthe Romansintheregion.Thearchitectureofthe"MedievalCity",oneoftherichest in the country, also confirms the presence of the Templars in the city.

ThecitycentreandtheJardimdoPaço(Bishop'sGarden)aresomeofthemost interestingplacestovisitinacitythatcombinesmoderntrendswitharich historical and cultural past.

Through the centuries the city has grown and today Castelo Brancois capital of the district. In 2007, Castelo Brancowas considered one of the best cities to live in Portugal and the 7th best city to live in Europe, due to its excellent quality of life.

Concerningeconomicactivity, there has been an enormous grow tho fall industrial activities and services, which confirms Castelo Branco's historic role as the capital of inland Portugal.

The city is served by many ways and means of transportation (train/bus/car), which allows the modernisation of the city and provides jobs in many areas.

CasteloBrancoisacity turned to the future. The city pretends to adjust to the European context level, with strong bets iny outh, which is the main population of the city. To do so, it's necessary to provide young people, not only with many and varied equipments to the practice of sports, but also with professional education and access to education.


ThecityisalsosupportedbytwoHealthCareCentres, several pharmacies, and clinics.

TOURISM

This region has several attractions, such as beautiful landscapes, gardens, and prehistoric and medieval monuments, among others.

However, the most important attraction in Castelo Branco is the extra ordinary JardimdoPaço(Bishop'sGarden), designed in the 18th century by the Bishop João de Mendonça. This garden is part of the Paço Episcopal (Bishop's Palace), where the Francisco Tavares Proença Júnior Museumislocated (archaeologicalartefacts,16thcenturyembroidery,etc.).Otherattractionsin CasteloBrancoaretheSacredArtMuseum;thebeautifulCruzeiroofS.João (ancient large stone cross set up in a public place) from the 15 th century andall the Medieval City.

The gastronomy is also a very good attraction. KidGoat, soups, several kindsofsausageandthefamousMaranhos(porkorgoatstomachfilledof rice, meat, and spices) are some of the most known and appreciated dishes. Borrachões(traditionaldrycakes), ArrozDoce(ricepuddingmadewithrice, milk, sugarandeggs), and Pão-de-Ló (traditional cake) are some of the most interestingsweets. In the regional gastronomy, we can also point out the CasteloBrancocheeses, which are registered as D.O.C. (Controlled Origin Denomination) with the names Queijode Castelo Branco (Castelo Branco cheese) and Queijo da Beira Baixa (Beira Baixa cheese).

CULTURE / LEISURE

ThemostimportantmonumentstovisitinCasteloBrancoaretheCargaleiro Museum, the Francisco Tavares Proença Júnior Museum, and the Sacred Art Museum.ThecityalsohasaPublicLibrary,sportsvenues,swimmingpool, bars, restaurants, clubs, and parks. The Cine-Teatro Avenida has performances of music, dance, and theatre every week.





Universities and Polytechnic Institutions can awardtheLicenciado(Bachelor-1stcycle) and Mestredegrees(Master-2ndcycle)while the universitiescanalsoawardthedegreeofDoutor (Ph.D. – 3rd cycle).







So, through the years, the IPCB has registered an increasing participation in several European programmes, such as Erasmus, Comenius, Lingua, Tempus,LeonardodaVinci,WindsorTreaty,etc.Besides thepartnership/cooperationdevelopedwithinthese programmes, there is also participation of the IPCB in severalInternationalAssociationsandtheexistence ofCooperationAgreementswithsomeuniversities.



TEACHING LANGUAGE

Classes are lectured in Portuguese and English. Students must have some knowledge of the Portugueselanguagebeforestartingcoursesat IPCB.Therefore, everyyearthe IPCB runsPortuguese coursesforforeigners(see:Languagesupport).

Forstudents evaluation (exams, tests, oral, and writtenwork), it is recommended that the student speaksinadvancewitheachteacheraboutusing the English language.

ACADEMIC YEAR

The academic year is usually divided into two semesters, running from September to January (Autumn Semester) and from February to June (Spring Semester).

Examinationsareheldfrommid-Januarytomid-February and in June/July.

ASSESSMENT AND GRADING SYSTEM

The Portuguese grading scale is from 0 to 20.

- 10 is the minimum passing grade
- 10 to 13 Sufficient to Satisfactory
- 14 and 15 Good
- 16 and 17 Very good
- 18 to 20 Excellent

Ingeneral, asystem of continuous assessment has been adopted, including tests and work produced during the semester.However,theremayalsobecompulsoryfinal examsforstudentswhohavefailed.Studentsshould alwaysreadtheregulationsforeachSchoolandcheck with the academic office (Serviços Académicos and CourseCoordinator)thetypeofassessmentthatis used in the subjects they are taking.



The students admitted will receive an acceptance letter.

Upon arrival the student should visit the International RelationsOffice(GRI)toregisterasanErasmusstudentand getthestudent'scard.Onlyafterthatthestudentshouldgo to the School and contact the Erasmus School Coordinator.



WHO CAN PARTICIPATE?

Thestudents from 27 members tates of the European Union, from the three countries of theEuropeanEconomicArea(Iceland,Liechtenstein,andNorway)orfromTurkey,have the possibility to study in Portugal for a period of between 3 and 12 months under the Erasmusprogramme, with a study grant and without paying any tuition fees at IPCB.

BILATERAL AGREEMENTS

The students wishing to participate should go to the International Relations Office of theirhomeuniversity and askabout the Erasmus programme and the possibilities that itoffers.Thestudentscanalsocheckinformationonthewebsiteofthehomeuniversity and our website in order to find out, among other things, about Bilateral Agreements between the IPCB and other Institutions.

THE LEARNING AGREEMENT

AnimportantdocumentoftheERASMUSstudyperiodistheLearningAgreement.This documents ets out the program me of studies which the student will follow abroad, aswellastheconfirmation of a cademic achievement protocol, and must be agreed and signed by the home university, the host university and the student. Any changes to that Learning Agreement should be agreed in writing by all three parts.

RECOGNITION OF STUDIES

If the student complies with the requirements of the Learning Agreement, then recognition of the study period abroad by the home university is assured. All student's rights, as well ashis/herobligationsasanERASMUSstudentareestablishedintheErasmusStudent Charter, which is given to each student before leaving for the study period abroad.






ON ARRIVAL






ItisnecessarytoinformtheInternationalRelations OfficeandtheHousingManageraboutdepartureat least two weeks in advance.

Attheendoftheexchangeperiod, the International Relations Office will prepare the "Transcript of Records" to be sent to the Institutional Coordinator of the Sending Institution. Whenever possible, this document will be prepared before the students leave.

The students should also fill in a question naire and sendit to the International Relations Office of the IPCB to inform us about his/hergeneral satisfaction with our services.







HOUSING


Students coming from a broad have two housing options: Students' halls of residence or private housing, where they can rent a flat to live alone or to share with other fellow students.



The IPCB maintains 4 halls of residence to provide its students with good accommodations at affordable prices. One hall of residence is located in Idanha-a-Nova.

Alltheroomsareequippedwithclosets, desks, chairs, beds, and central heating.

Theresidencesareorganisedintwodoublebedroom flatswithashowerandtoilet,andasmallhall.Each floorhasakitchenandalaundryroom.Themonthly rent is 125 € per person.

Thiscardcanbeusedincaseofhealthemergencies. If necessary, students should go to the Emergency Service of any Hospital, show this card and pay 8.20€.Incase of illness, students should go to the Health Centre.

Thepharmaciestimetableisasfollow:fromMonday to Friday 8:30 – 19:00, Saturday until 13:00. At night, onweekends, and holidays there is always an emergency Pharmacy service.

IPCB is part of a major nationwide electronic Universitynetworkcallede-U.Thishasenabledthe onlinecreation of online university services, the production and sharing of a cademic contents, and internet(andintranet)accessfrominsideandoutside the IPCB at anytime and from any place.

All campus is covered by a wireless network, and studentscanusetheirlaptopstoaccesstheinternet and IPCB's services from any point in IPCB. There are specialworkstationsthatarespecificallyequipped for the use of this network.





LEISURE / SPORT ACTIVITIES

The Castelo Branco region offers a wide choice ofleisure activities. For those interested in sports there are several recreation facilities. For outdoor sports it is recommended to take full advantage of living near the countryside; running, biking, hiking, and nature sports are the most frequent.

Several local associations run their own sport activities and it is up to each student to discover them.Forexample, there are several gyms that offer a wide range of services such as sauna, fitness, martialarts, oryoga. Everyone will find something suitable. For all those who want to feel the Portuguese summer, going to the swimming pool will be also a regular activity during the hot Summer days.









STUDENTS' UNION (FACAB)

All the Schools of IPCB have a Students' Union. The main activities of these unions are to represent students in the management boards of the School, to provide the students with several services, such as paper stationery and photocopies, and to organize several sport and cultural activities.
