### The Campus

The campus is located in the Akrotiri area. It covers an area of 750 acres. The Campus is 7 km northwest of Chania. At the Campus you will find the University Halls of Residence, the University Restaurant and Cafeterias, the Library, the Information Systems Centre, (Computer Centre), the Network Operations Centre, the Careers Office, the classrooms, lecture halls and laboratories and the faculty offices.

The local bus ticket from Chania city to the Campus, is 0,40 €. Students have to show their Greek student card in order to obtain this fare reduction.
