| Spanish Course | Compulsory for all incoming students. Two different levels are offered: Intermediate and Advanced. No credits are awarded for this course. An attendance certificate will be issued. |
| Housing | <p><u>Temporary accommodation:</u> Incoming students usually stay at the Youth Hostel for the first days of their stay in Cordoba. Reservations should be made well in advance on www.inturjoven.com. The address of the Youth Hostel in Cordoba is: INTURJOVEN, S.A. Albergue de la Juventud. Plza Judá Leví, s/n. 14003 – Cordoba.</p> <p><u>Definite accommodation:</u> Exchange students will have a tutor from the Grupo Europa, who will meet them upon arrival in Cordoba. Tutors help students look for and arrange definite accommodation and take care of their integration in Cordoba.</p> <p>Spanish students usually live in rented flats shared with other students. Prices range from 150€ to 250€ a month, depending on the area where the flat is located. A deposit equivalent to one month's rent will have to be paid together with the first month's rent. This deposit will be returned after the renting period if no incidences occurred.</p> |
| Living Costs | <p>Living in Cordoba is not very expensive, although expenses vary according to personal requirements and standards; 400€/month is the average cost for a student in our city, including housing and food.</p> <p>Eating out in Spain is often cheap and meals are substantial. Breakfast and lunch are served at ETEA's cafeteria at a good price.</p> <p>The bus is the most common public transport in our town (http://www.aucorsa.net/). Either a single ticket or a 10-ticket "Bonobús" can be acquired. Special fare is applied to students getting a "Bonobús". These can be bought at tobacconist's and news-stands.</p> |
| Insurance | Students from EU countries must apply for the European Health Card in their country before travelling to Spain or the E-111/128 forms. The health card and these forms will entitle them to medical care within the Spanish Social Security system. Foreign students from countries outside the EU must subscribe a private insurance policy. |
