
GUIDE HOW TO CHOOSE THE RIGHT COURSES

STEP 2. CHOOSE COURSE (below you find an example)

Accounting and Control (7.5 ECTS credits)

The course develops an understanding of management control and the legal environment and other directions concerning auditing in private companies and public authorities. It will enable students to conceptually and practically understand the objectives and results of management control as well as auditing as a process to independently appraise the economic actions and events of organisations. It develops various skills necessary for the conduct of an audit and it will also develop audit aspects of corporate governance, environmental and social responsibility and ethical issues.

Education level: Master's level

STEP 4. MAKE SURE TO DISTRIBUTE THE COURSES OVER THE WHOLE SEMESTER

You will study from week 35 during 2013 until week 03 in 2014(and some of you even one more semester). The weeks are counted with start in January, so the first week in January is week nr 1. Fulltime studies is 30 ECTS for a complete semester.

This is just an example of courses, where no consideration is taken into account if they are suitable to combine or not. I would just like to demonstrate how to think with the weeks and study pace.

Example of combinations 2.

Business English 1
Study pace: **50%**

Period of study: Week 36-03

ECTS-credits: 15

Behavioural Economics Study pace: **50%**

Period of study: Week 35-44

ECTS-credits: 7,5

(These two courses will together during the first half of the semester make 100% study pace. If you add the one below you have 100% over the whole semester.

Intercultural Communication 1, Media Arts and Literature

Study pace: 50%

Period of study: Week 45-03

ECTS-credits: 7,5

Total amount of credits: 30 ECTS

There are of course other ways of combining too. You can combine a 100% course with a course on 50% pace during the same period, but then you must be aware of that the study pace will be more than full-time studies and it is a risk of colliding schedules. This can be solved with friends taking notes, as long as none of the colliding lectures are mandatory. This you can only find out when you are here, or by e-mailing the teachers when you have received your schedules (available online about 3 weeks before the course starts). It is not allowed to take 200% at the same time as you would occupy a seat for a course and most likely drop it after a while or not pass it.

I hope you had the study pace in consideration when you chose courses as well as checked when the course is offered, but if not, please check what you are admitted for, to see if it works. STEP 5. STUDY PLANNER

Use the study planner if you think it is difficult to find out what courses that are offered during certain weeks. That will eliminate all other courses. (Think about choosing language of instruction "English" and "campus" and not "distance". It is allowed to apply for distance courses but as you won't meet other students it is not to recommend and it would be difficult for you to get integrated with other students).
