


## Navigating Lnu.se and choosing appropriate courses

To find the courses offered for exchange students at Linnaeus University you should follow the directions below:

1. Go to lnu.se
2. Click "In English" in the right hand corner
3. Click "Education" on the left hand side of the web page
4. Click "Exchange Students" on the menu on the left hand side of the web page

You are now on the pages directed towards prospective exchange students.

5. Click "Course listing" or "Programme listing" on the left hand side of the web page
6. In this view you see all the courses or programmes offered for exchange students, regardless of semester or campus. You can now choose to filter the list to narrow your search. Among other things you can filter by semester, or campus. Please note that the School of Design campus Kalmar is located in the nearby town Nybro, and if you want to see their courses (glass design and furniture design) you should not choose the filter Kalmar, but instead filter by design courses.

1. Click on the link to the course you are interested in.

Now you can see detailed information about the course, which department it is given by and which prerequisites are required. It also shows practical information about during which period of the semester, at what study pace and on which campus the course/programme is offered. If a course is offered on both campuses, both campuses will show up even if you have used the filter to mark only one of the campuses. (Please note that you can only study at one campus per semester). Notice that even though you have filtered on a specific semester, it will show all the semesters the course is offered. The filtered semester is marked in black and the other semesters are marked in grey.

The above example is a regular course, which is offered at full study pace (100%) on campus Kalmar, during the first period of the semester, the first five weeks. Each semester is divided into 4 periods; each period is 5 weeks long. The normal procedure is that you study one regular course in each period, so please take the periods into consideration when you choose your courses.

Besides the regular classes you may have distance courses at a lower study pace (see example below). A distance course means that the course is offered online. A distance course can still require a few physical meetings. As an exchange student, it is not an option for you to choose distance courses only. A part-time course is a course that is given at a lower study pace, in the example below on 20%, which means that it will continue for a longer time and demand less each week. A full time course is 100% study pace, and it demands 40 hours per week.

## Business Talking, 3 credits

### **Prerequisites**

It is very important that you take the prerequisites into consideration when choosing courses. The prerequisites describe what previous knowledge you must have to be eligible for each course. The Admissions Office evaluates the Official Transcript of Records you include in your Online Application and evaluates if you are eligible for a course based on your transcript.
