Information for the ERASMUS (Europe) or PARTNERSHIP (outside Europe) Program 2012/13

Dear Mobility Students

Thank you for your application to the above mentioned exchange program at the University of Lucerne. Please take note of the following details regarding your stay:

Visa – Entering – Registration

First, please check whether you require a visa for entering Switzerland. Students from EUand EFTA-countries need only a valid passport or identity card. Students from countries with a visa requirement need to apply for a visa at the Swiss embassy or Swiss consulate general in their home country at least three months before entering Switzerland. **Please take note that students from the above mentioned countries cannot be matriculated at the University of Lucerne without having a valid visa**.

If you are unsure whether or not you need a visa, please consult your local Swiss representation office <u>http://www.eda.admin.ch/eda/en/home/reps.html</u> For a visa you have to send following documents to the Swiss embassy or Swiss consulate general:

- Curriculum vitae
- Letter of motivation
- Written proof of financial means (your parents or your Home University have to confirm in a hardcopy letter that you have the financial means to do you study abroad semester at the University of Lucerne)
- Confirmation from your Home University that you leave Switzerland after ending your mobility semester at the University of Lucerne
- Your Future plans?
- Fully completed application form for residence for the Office of Migration (Form 3, only available in German on http://www.migration.lu.ch/index/formulare.htm)

All documents will be sent directly to the Office for Migration, Lucerne.

Please note that it usually takes 6 to 12 weeks to obtain a visa. The registration and all documents (foreigner's identity card, visa (if applicable) etc.) are chargeable: see costs and fees!

From Zurich to Lucerne

Once you clear customs at Zurich airport, head to the train station (SBB) at the airport terminals building (signs point to it) and take a train to Lucerne (avoid confusing it with Lausanne). Trains run every 30 minutes, and one per hour is direct, the other requires a change of trains at Zurich central station. Check <u>http://www.sbb.ch</u> for schedules. Cost is about CHF 28. In Lucerne, the train station is right in the center of town, use the exit at the right side of the station to get directly to our university (modern white building).

If you plan on travelling around in Switzerland by train, it might be a good idea to get a half fare card for the trains. This card also gives you a discount on busses, boats and cable cars. Registration and deregistration at the Communal Registration Office

After entering Switzerland and **AFTER registration at the University of Lucerne** you have to register at your commune of residence. For the registration you need documents, please see "Registration at the University of Lucerne".

At the end of your exchange, please do not forget to deregister at the communal registration office.

Registration and deregistration at the Immigration Office

After the registration at the communal registration office you also need to register at the immigration office <u>www.migration.lu.ch</u>. Some communal registration offices even carry out the registration at the immigration office by themselves (for further information, please ask your communal registration office). For the registration you need documents, please see "Registration at the University of Lucerne".

The communal registration office will deregister you at the immigration office. There is no need for you to deregister personally at the immigration office.

Fees for the Communal Registration and Registration at the Immigration Office

The registration (approx. EUR 30-50) and all officially issued documents (approx. EUR 50-250) are chargeable. The University of Lucerne assumes no cost.

Residence permit

After the registration, the residence permit will be issued and delivered. Please send a copy of the permit to the Mobility Office of the University of Lucerne.

Registration at the University of Lucerne

The Mobility Office will send you an appointment for your registration at the University of Lucerne in due time.

For your registration at the University of Lucerne you have to bring along the following documents in duplicate (please prepare two documents sets, we will make no copies). We will give you no student card if this are not complete.

For exchange students inside Europa

- A recent passport photo
- A copy of ID or Passport (take the original with you)
- A copy of confirmation "exchange program" from the University of Lucerne
- A copy of your Health Insurance Policy / International Health Card with coverage for Switzerland
- A copy of "Foreign insurer's confirmation for the purpose of exemption from compulsory healthcare insurance in Switzerland" (it is not necessary, if you will make a new insurance in Switzerland)
- A copy of your Private Liability Insurance, if you have rented a mobility room from the University of Lucerne
- If applicable: a copy of the rental agreement of your apartment in Switzerland (you will receive this agreement from your Swiss landlord)
- Fully completed application form for residence for the Office of Migration (Form 3, only available in German on <u>http://www.migration.lu.ch/index/formulare.htm</u>)

For exchange students from overseas

Health and Accident Insurance

For exchange students inside Europa

If your stay in Switzerland lasts longer than three months, you will need a health and accident insurance <u>http://www.unilu.ch/deu/einreise in die schweiz 4254.aspx</u> The (international) health and accident insurance cover is compulsory in Switzerland and has to be confirmed by your personal insurance company at home. **Please send us a copy of your European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) or of your personal insurance policy**. If the health insurance cover proofs to be insufficient for Switzerland, exchange students will have to take out an insurance policy in Switzerland, after your arrival in Lucerne (costs approx. EURO 70.--/month). Please contact the Mobility Office for more information.

Attention: Travel insurance taken out in your home country will not be accepted!

Foreign insurer's confirmation for the purpose of exemption from compulsory healthcare insurance in Switzerland (Article 2 Paragraph 4 of the Health Insurance Directive, KVV)

Requirement for an exemption : Persons staying in Switzerland for training or further education, namely students, schoolchildren, trainees and persons undergoing work exprience, are eligible for exemption provided they have equivalent insurance cover. Exemption is granted for the length of their training and stay, subject to a maximum of 3 years. In order to receive the form "Foreign insurer's confirmation for the purpose of exemption from compulsory health care insurance in Switzerland", please contact the Mobility Office. The

application will be reviewed by the Social Security Insurance (AHV) after your registration at the Communal Registration Office

AHV = the AHV is the most important pillar of the Swiss pension scheme. As a national insurance the AHV is mandatory for all persons living in Switzerland).

No forms necessary for Students from EU countries, which are connected in their home country of a compulsory health insurance and they have a relevant European health insurance card.

Form required for Students from non-EU countries, who have a private health insurer. With stamped and signed by the foreign insurer will confirms that all benefits (Article 2 Paragraph 4 of the Health Insurance Directive, KVV) be fully recognized.

For exchange students from overseas

The Swiss Federal Act on Insurance Contracts (KVG) stipulates a strict and complete insurance coverage, which is being examined by the Swiss Social Insurance AHV. For your stay in Switzerland you will need a health and accident insurance. <u>This is mandatory and the exchange students have to take out an insurance policy in Switzerland</u> (costs approx. EURO 70.--/month). The Mobility Office recommend you the Swiss Care www.swisscare-intl.com or will give you further information after your arrival in Lucerne.

Attention: Insurance policy and Travel insurance taken out in your home country from overseas will not be accepted!

AHV = the AHV is the most important pillar of the Swiss pension scheme. As a national insurance the AHV is mandatory for all persons living in Switzerland).

Personal Liability Insurance

Personal liability insurance offers an insurance cover in case of third party liability claims. Please inform yourself at your own insurance company, whether your insurance cover is sufficient. Personal liability insurance is not compulsory in Switzerland; it is however strongly recommended (e.g. in case of renting an apartment or room). A **personal liability insurance is compulsory if you rent a mobility room from the University of Lucerne.** The insurance can be taken out once you have arrived in Lucerne (costs approx. EURO 70.--/year). Please contact the Mobility Office for more information.

Banc Account

If you want to open a bank account in Lucerne, we recommend you the "Cantonal banc of Lucerne" (LUKB) <u>https://www.lukb.ch/english-window.html</u> For opening an account you must have a valid ID or passport and a copy of the confirmation of the mobility program of the University of Lucerne.

CampusCard

Upon registration at the Mobility Office you will receive your own personal CampusCard, which identifies you as a student of the University of Lucerne (necessary for lectures, assessments etc.). Also you can make copy and pay in the cafeteria with the Campus Card.

StudMail- and StudNet-Account

You will receive an official e-mail account from the University of Lucerne. In order to activate this account, the following steps are necessary: Your *StudMail*-details will be sent to the e-mail address you have indicated at your registration (please check also your spams). The details regarding your *StudNet-Account* will then be sent directly to your new *StudMail*-account. During your stay, all information will be sent exclusively to your *StudMail*. Therefore, please check your *StudMail* regularly - at least once a week - and make sure that your inbox has enough storage space at all times.

Payment of Scholarships (applicable only for the ERASMUS program)

If you visit the University of Lucerne on the basis of the ERASMUS program, you are not entitled to a scholarship. For a scholarship of ERASMUS please ask your home university.

Mentoring programme

With the mentoring programme, mentors, which are regular Lucerne students, accompany the exchange students during their stay at the University of Lucerne. In order to make things easier, the mentors can help with all sorts of questions and problems, that are not related to the exchange students' studies or administrative issues: For instance, opening a Swiss bank account or getting a Swiss cell phone plan.

With the direct contact to Swiss students, exchange students feel much more integrated and can enjoy their experience to the fullest. The allocation of mentors is performed by the Mobility Office.
